Brooks Pierce partner Justin Outling has been invited to deliver the keynote address at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro's (UNC-Greensboro) commencement on Dec. 7. More than 2,000 students are expected to receive degrees during the ceremony.

Outling, an alumnus of the university, serves as co-chair of the UNC-Greensboro Board of Visitors alongside his wife Cora, a fellow graduate of UNC-Greensboro. Outling graduated from UNC-Greensboro in 2005 with a degree in political science before receiving his law degree from Duke University.
