This year's symposium will discuss the impact COVID-19 has had on bankruptcies, *Qui Tam* lawsuits, employment law and constitutional law in North Carolina.

Sanders and Thaller-Moran will be joined by Gavin Bell as panelists to discuss labor and employment issues during the pandemic in the session entitled, "Working in a Pandemic: Employment Law & *Qui Tam* Claims," moderated by Melissa Essary, Dean Emerita and professor at Campbell Law School.
